
## Connecting

- Access PressReader through the school's Wifi. Once you're authenticated, there will be a green cup displayed on the top right corner of the screen (on the top bottom corner on the app).
- Once you login to your PressReader account under the school's Wifi, you will be authenticated for 168 hours (7 days). After 168 hours, you will be asked to authenticate again by accessing PressReader through the school's WiFi.




# **Changing Language**

- Select any language of your preference from the list to enjoy PressReader in a selected language.




# Sign Up


- Free, one-step registration means that signing up for PressReader is as easy as it is affordable. All you need to provide is your email address, password and name.
- You can also sign up using your school's email address to get access through the school's email domain.

## **Browse** Publications


- Once you login, you can see your favourite publications. Go ahead with saving your favourite publication by clicking 'Add to My Publications' when you open the publication for easy access.
- Scroll down to see Recently Read, Featured, Newspapers and Magazines by Categories.






### **Browse** Feed


- When you click on For You, you will see Top Stories automatically populated from the latest publications in your location.
- This unlimited newsfeed is easy to browse; simply scroll right across the screen and new articles will appear in an easy-to-read horizontal stream called **SmartFlow**.
- Find an article that catches your eye? Just click on the article title or the little green arrow at the bottom of the article to reveal the full story.



#### Search


- Find articles from newspapers and magazines that you already love and discover new publications with the crosstitle **Search** feature. Looking for stories on a particular topic? Scroll to the bottom of this list to open **Advanced Search**.
- You can use Advanced Search to search across specific titles available on PressReader from a set day or time frame.
   You can also filter your search results by language, date, where the keywords were located and by author.






#### **Personalize**

# Fraud conviction for boss of blood test startup may rock Silicon Valley

The founder of the blood testing company Theranos, Elizabeth Holmes, was found guilty on Monday of fraud, concluding a high-profile trial that captivated Silicon Valley.

After seven days of deliberation, the jury in San Jose, California, convicted her of four charges: one count of conspiracy to defraud investors, and three counts of wire fraud against investors, using tele-communications. It acquitted her on three charges, including one of conspiracy to defraud patients and two charges related to patients who received inaccurate test results. It remained deadlocked on three remaining charges.



## Share, Discuss, and Save

- Reading the news is much more rewarding when you can share it with friends, discuss with others and save it for future reference. Free registration enables you to:
  - Share articles with friends, family, colleagues and your legion of adoring social media followers.
  - Copy stories into your Evernote, OneNote, or Instapaper accounts with just one click.
  - Print articles in hardcopy or save them as PDFs.
  - Vote on viewpoints being presented in an article by supporting or opposing them.
  - Comment on articles and view the comments and profiles of others who also had something to say. Through their profiles you will discover other articles they have saved which may be of interest to you as well.
  - Add your Opinion to your comments to connect you with like-minded people.
     Together you can share your viewpoint throughout multiple articles to gain support or spark debate with other readers.
  - Save to Collection Mark articles for future reference and organize them into Collections. One of the benefits of saves stories is that they are always accessible to you even when the publication from which they originated is no longer available.



# How and when can you use PressReader?

- John wakes up and checks news on his phone. This is important part of his routine since he studies international relations.
- John drops by the library at school to read newspapers. He opens up PressReader.
- He logs into his PressReader account at the library as he can have his access for 7 days without dropping by the library or campus to authenticate himself again.

- Once he logs into his PressReader account on campus and reads publications, he wouldn't need to authenticate again for 7 days.
- As long as he is on campus using PressReader via school's Wifi, he does not necessarily need to be at the library to read on PressReader.
- John wants to continue reading on PressReader on the way back home. He decided to download the PressReader app on his tablet PC.
