

The report from the American committee.

Lord John Cavendish moved to recommit the proposed Lord Joh address which had been agreed to in the committee. He Cavendish strongly recommended the reconsideration of a measure which he deemed fraught with fo much mischief. Commented on the proposed address; thought it improper to affert that a rebellion exists; mentioned the insecurity created by the act for changing the government of Massachussets Bay; faid the inhabitants knew not for a moment under what government they lived. His head and heart combined to deprecate the horrors of civil war, necessarily involving a foreign one also with the combined forces of very powerful nations. He represented the jealousy of our neighbours, from their differace and our glory in the last war. If the Americans should hear of our having declared them rebels, and that more force is coming, may they not determine rather to attack a part, than wait for the whole? A fmall rather than a greater number? He stated very clearly and justly our domestic situation, our state with the colonies and with soreign powers. He called the attention of the House to the





#### TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY :-

#### PART I.—ORIGIN AND INCEPTION.

#### I .- INTRODUCTORY.

1. The first section of the "Special Commissions (Dardanelles and Mesopotamia) Act, 1916," which received Your Majesty's assent on August 17th, 1916, provides, inter alia, that ten Commissioners are to be appointed " for the purpose of inquiring into the origin, inception, and conduct of operations of war in the Dardanelles and Gallipoli, including the supply of drafts, reinforcements, ammunition and equipment to the troops and Fleet, the provision for the sick and wounded, and the responsibility of those departments of Government whose duty it has been to minister to the wants of the forces employed in that theatre of war." Some time must necessarily elapse before we can deal with the whole of the somewhat wide field of inquiry which, it will be seen, was contemplated by the Legislature. We have, therefore, thought it advisable to take advantage of the powers conferred on us by the sixth section of the Act in order to make an interim report dealing exclusively with the origin and inception of the attack on the Dardanelles. This mode of procedure will, we think, be found convenient for several reasons, and notably because, as we shall presently show, the methods adopted for attaining the objects, which His Majesty's Government had in view when the attack on the Dardanelles was conceived, speedily underwent considerable and important modifications.

Our colleagues, the Rt. Hon. Andrew Fisher, the Hon. Sir Thomas Mackenzie, K.C.M.G., and Mr. W. F. Roch, M.P., are not in entire agreement with our Report, and

their minutes of dissent are appended thereto.

2. We shall endeavour to describe the various phases which prevailed during different and consecutive periods, and, so far as is possible, to assign precise dates to the transformations of method which occurred. For the moment, however, it will be sufficient to say that we shall assume that the period of origin and inception commenced at the outbreak of the war with Germany on August 4th, 1914, and concluded on March 23rd, 1915, on which day it may be said for all precisely provided the said of the said o









### Margaret Hippsが炭鉱での労働について 上院で行った証言

No. 233. Margaret Hipps, 17 years old, putter:

45 On short shifts I work from eight in the morning till six at night; on long ones until 10 at night: occasionally we work all night. When at night-work, from six at night till eight and ten in the morning.

Only bread is taken below; and the only rests we have are those we have to wait upon the men for while picking the coal.

My employment, after reaching the wall-face, is to fill a bagie, or slype, with 2½ to 3 cwt. of coal. I then hook it on to my chain, and drag it through the seam, which is 26 to 28 inches high, till I get to the main-road—a good distance, probably 200 to 400 yards. The

pavement I drag over is wet, and I am obliged at all times to crawl on hands and feet with my bagic hung to the chain and ropes.

55 I turn the contents of the bagies into the carts till they are filled; and then run them upon the ironrails to the shaft, a distance of 400 to 500 yards.

It is sad sweating and sore fatiguing work, and frequently maims the women. My left hand is short of a finger, which laid me idle four months.

[Reads and writes. Very ill-informed. Is a fine personable woman, above the middle 60 stature and rather stout.

It is almost incredible to believe that human beings can submit to such employment, crawling on hands and knees, harnessed like horses, over soft slushy floors more difficult than dragging the same weights through our lowest common-sewers, and more difficult in consequence of the inclination, which is frequently one in three to one in six.]

8. The workings in the narrow seams are sometimes 100 to 200 yards from the main roads; so that the females have to crawl backwards and forwards with their small carts in seams in many cases not exceeding 22 to 28 inches in height. This will be found illustrated in the statement of Margaret Hipps, coal-putter, numbered



231 in the Evidence. The danger and difficulties of dragging on roads dipping from 1 foot in 3 to 1 foot in 6 may be more easily conceived than explained; and the state which females are in after pulling like horses through these holes—their perspiration, their exhaustion, and very frequently even their tears, it is painful in the extreme to witness; yet, when the work is done, they return to it with a vigour which is surprising, considering how they inwardly hate it. The business of these females is to remove the coals from the hewer, who has picked them from the wall-face, and, placing them either on their backs, which they invariably do when working in edge seams, or in little carts when on levels, &c., to carry them to the main-road, whence they are convered to the circle of the carry that the carry that the carry them to the main-road,

App. 475. Mr. Sharman Crawford. Sig. 7,000. 5289. The Petition of the undersigned Mill B Operatives and others, agreed to at a public meeting held in Belfast, on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, 1846,

Humbly sheweth,

That the present hours of factory labour are injurious to health, and preclude the opportunities of mental improvement.

That many of your Petitioners are compelled to work from twelve to thirteen hours per day, in heated and badly ventilated rooms; and that the sudden transition from such places to the open air tends to undermine the health, and is the cause of many fatal diseases.

Your Petitioners further submit to the consideration of your honourable House that, from the lengthened hours of factory labour, they are unable to avail themselves of any opportunities for self-cultivation; and, from the want of early education, they are forced to spend their lives in ignorance.

That those who can read are little disposed to do so after the fatigues of the day, when the physical energies have become weakened by over-exertion.

Your Petitioners further submit, that the



That it having been expressly laid down by high authorities that the possession of property in this country carries with it the right to vote in the election of representatives in Parliament, it is an evident anomaly that some holders of property are allowed to use this right, while others, forming no less a constituent part of the nation, and equally quali-fied by law to hold property, are not able to exercise this privilege.

That the participation of women in the Government is consistent with the principles of the British Constitution, inasmuch as women in these islands have always been held capable of sovereignty, and women are eligible for various public offices.

Your Petitioners therefore humbly pray your honorable House to consider the expediency of providing for the representation of all householders, without distinction of sex, who possess such property or rental qualifica-tion as your honorable House may determine.

That the Bill for the extension of the jurisdiction of county courts to sums not exceeding £50 is now returned to your honourable House, amended by the right honourable the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, by the insertion of a clause giving concurrent jurisdiction to the courts at Westminster in all cases where the sums sought to be recovered exceed £20.

That your Petitioners are wholesale tradesmen, whose debts are of necessity spread over the whole country, and that, if compelled to resort to the proposed county courts, they will be subjected to the annoyance, inconvenience, and expense of sending to a distance their books, principal clerks, warehousemen, and porters, in order to prove the justice of their demands.

That the proposed Bill without such concurrent jurisdiction may be beneficial to retail tradesmen, and those parties who reside in the immediate neighbourhood of each other, but will be very inconvenient and oppressive to your Petitioners
